Because of a new law several communities in California have announced bans on cell phones from trash pickup. But thanks to CellForCash.com residents now have a profitable alternative.

Recently a ban went into effect in Yolo County California. Beginning February 9th residents are prohibited from disposing hazardous wastes items in their everyday garbage. Instead, hazardous waste items, including cell phones, must be recycled.

Programs banning electronic devices from regular trash pickups are becoming more common throughout the country, Mosieur said. The cash payments offered by www.CellForCash.com are a viable alternative to simply handing over old cell phones to recyclers who don't pay for the devices.

CellForCash.com pays for over 500 different models of used cell phones and then re-markets them around the world. Some recycled cell phones are used in the company's 911 Cell Phone Bank program, which provides no-cost emergency cell phones to elderly and abused throughout the country.
