



Average Cost of Sporting Injuries Skyrockets To \$127 Per Participant

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The cost of sporting injuries has risen to an average of \$127 per participant per year amongst the top 10 most played sports, according to recently published research work.

Surveying the top 10 most popular US sports at amateur level, the study revealed a shocking \$127 per player per year price tag for sporting injury treatments, such as sprained ankles, ligament damage, and broken bones.

Unfortunately now this means amateur athletes may need to look into individual insurance policies to cover themselves against the growing perceived risks."
